HYPE is designed to meet the needs of students after school by providing a safe, secure, and loving environment for study, character development, and team building. The HYPE After School Programs offer Academic Enrichment, Homework Assistance from certified teachers and college mentors. Food and Nutrition, Art, Dance, and Music classes. Spanish language lessons are also offered. Tae Kwon Do classes are also offered as a means to improve behavior. The students also receive recreational enrichment activities during the week.
